# Application for Renewal of Local Council Charter

## INSTRUCTION SHEET

- FIRST, Note carefully Special Notice concerning procedure for filing Council roster and registering Council Scouters on other side of this sheet.
- SECOND, Make sure that all printed report forms are filled out completely and forwarded with application for charter renewal.
  - NOTE:—Camping report may be filled out and transmitted direct to National Camping Service in advance of the application for charter renewal.
- THIRD, In addition, the following should be forwarded with application for charter renewal:-
  - A-Charter Fee.
  - B-Report of 1935 audit, if completed. (See No. 3 below.)
  - C—Copy of Scout Executive's report to Council.
  - D-Special report on community service.
  - E-Council program and objectives for 1936.
- FOURTH, The following paragraph numbers refer to similarly numbered paragraphs in application form.

  1. Jurisdiction.

Describe accurately entire territory of Council, giving names of Counties included. If a County is divided, list names of Townships included. If a Township is divided, list names of separate communities included.

- 3. The National Constitution requires that the accounts of every Local Council be audited annually. Professional audit is preferred, but audit by an Auditing Committee is acceptable, provided it is complete and the report includes actual financial statements signed by the Committee. A mere statement that the books have been audited and found correct is not sufficient. The Council President, Treasurer, Finance Committee Chairman or Scout Executive should not be included on the Auditing Committee.
- 4. Quota does not include charter fee. A schedule of monthly or quarterly quota payments is preferred, unless quota in full is paid with application for charter renewal, or will be paid early in the year.
- 6. Credit is granted by National Supply Service only in accordance with specific authorization by Executive Board of Local Council.
- 8. Every institution sponsoring a Troop is entitled to name a representative on the Local Council (National By-Laws, Article XI, Section 1, Clause 6 and Section 2, Clause 7).
  - 9. Net separations means total dropped minus dropped reregistered.
- 12. This refers to comprehensive survey covering all phases of Council organization and operation. Outlines may be secured from National Council.
- 15. Camping Report, (Form 1020) covering the Camping Program of the Council for the entire year (not only summer camp) should accompany charter application if it has not been transmitted previously.
- 18. The term "Commissioner" as used here includes District and Field Commissioners and their Assistants.
- 19. It is important that the principle of religious representation be maintained as provided in the Constitution and By-Laws of the Boy Scouts of America.
- 20. Official action by the Council or Executive Board authorizing and approving the application and reports is required, as evidenced by the date called for.

Omission of signatures will necessitate return of the application.

Financial Report—Please use only the classification as provided. This is essential in order to make comparative studies of Local Council budget and expenditures.
